Introduction

Climbing Escalade Canada (CEC) is Canada's National Federation member of World Climbing (previously International Federation of Sport Climbing (IFSC). As such, CEC endorses and implements all World Climbing Rules, except for the changes outlined in this document.

This **CEC Competition Rules** amends the rules from the World Climbing to suit the Canadian context. This document should be read in conjunction with the latest version of the World Climbing Competition Rules, World Climbing Competition Regulation and World Climbing Para **Climbing Competition Regulation** available at

All instances of World Climbing / IFSC will be replaced by CEC.

PART 2 – CEC Competition Regulations

Reference: World Climbing Competition Regulations (version 2.0, March 2025)

1. General

- 1.1 The CEC may approve the organisation of events:
 - Canadian Speed National Championship
 - Canadian Para-Climbing National Championship
 - Canadian Senior Boulder National Championship
 - Canadian Senior Lead National Championship
 - Canadian Youth Boulder Eastern | Western Regional
 - Canadian Youth Boulder National Championship
 - Canadian Youth Lead National Championship
 - Other sanctioned climbing competition including
 - North American Cup Series (NACS)
- 1.3 The CEC will issue an Event Central Page on its website not less than 60 days in advance of the competition confirming its location, registration deadline and arrangements as described in §6 of the CEC Rules Amendment (Part 2). The registration deadline should not be less than 2 weeks to the first day of the competition.
- 1.4 Each Provincial and Territorial Sports Organization (PTSO) will be entitled to nominate athletes as per the quotas published by the CEC for the relevant year, provided that the federation is not in default of:
 - A) any regulation governing financial obligations to the CEC
 - B) any decision, or required action, under the CEC Disciplinary Rules,

All nominated athletes must hold a CEC Licence.

- 1.5 CEC Members are the Provincial and Territorial Sport Organizations (PTSOs). Refer to the CEC website for an up to date list of members.
- 1.6 Not used.

2. Applicable Codes and Regulations

- 2.1 Each person taking part in a CEC sanctioned event must comply with the CEC Competition Rules, these regulations, and any amendments noted in the Event Information Sheet posted on the CEC website.
- 2.2 The following sporting codes also have the status of rules for the purposes of these regulations published on the CEC website

- Safe Sport Requirements pertaining to the Canadian Safe Sport Program (CSSP)
- Anti-Doping Requirements pertaining to the <u>Canadian Anti-Doping Program</u> (CADP)
- At this time, CEC does not adopt or enforce the <u>World Climbing Uniform Code</u> for its domestic competitions. No specific uniform requirements apply to CEC-sanctioned events.

3. Safety

Injuries

- 3.1 The Jury President will confirm that a competition First Aid Attendant is available to attend any accident or injury to any participant. The competition FA Attendant must be present for all scheduled warm-ups and competition events.
- 3.2 The Jury President is responsible for deciding whether an injured competitor may continue or return to competition. The Jury President will consult with the competition First Aid Attendant, coach, competitor (and guardian if the competitor is a minor), or other available medical resources in making an informed assessment. The priority must be to safeguard the health and safety of the climber. The potential outcome of the competition must never influence such decisions.

Safety Petitions

3.3 Team officials may make a Safety Petition where a serious safety issue is believed to exist. Safety Petitions must be made in writing and signed by the Team Managers from 3 separate teams. If the Jury President agrees that a serious safety issue exists, they must address the issue without delay. Any Safety Petition, and its resolution, must be reported to the CEC Executive Director.

4. The Competition Area

- 4.1 Only the following people assigned to the event may enter the Competition Area:
 - CEC National Officials, judges, and setting team
 - CEC and event staff, and designated volunteers
 - Competitors participating in the current round
 - other persons authorised by the Jury President. Such persons must be supervised and must not distract or interfere with any climber.

5. The Clothing and Equipment

6. Competition Schedule

6.2 Registered athletes withdrawing or not attending the competition, are required to contact the Event Lead via WhatsApp two hours before the technical meeting. Failure to do so may result in a yellow card.



7. Start List, Results and Ranking

- 7.1 All start lists, results and rankings will be prepared and published using the CEC Results Service. If the CEC Results Service is unavailable, the Jury President may authorise use of a backup system and in this case the results of the competition will remain provisional until verified using the CEC Results Service.
- 7.4 Event seedings will be determined randomly.
- 7.9 to 7.14 Not applicable.

8. Medals, Ceremonies and Prizes

- 8.1 Medal ceremonies will be held as soon as practical following the end of each event.
- 8.3 Prize money will be awarded per the amounts established by the CEC Board, or any greater amount agreed by the CEC and the event organiser. Tied climbers will receive the average of the prize money for the tied places.
- 8.4 Not applicable.

- 8.6 Refer to the Foreign Nationals Policy (CEC-OP-09).

9. Disciplinary Procedures

- 9.2 As soon as practical after imposing a sanction, the Official in charge will fill the <u>CEC</u> <u>Disciplinary Measure Form</u> to report the issue to CEC. The CEC will determine if further sanctions are to be assessed by the Board of Directors.
- 9.3 If a person receives 3 cautions in the same season, their CEC Licence will be suspended after the competition where they received the 3rd caution. The duration of this suspension will be decided by the CEC Board of Directors.

10. Appeals

11. Unplanned Events

11.1 Unplanned events and weather-related interruptions will be handled by the CEC Event Lead and CEC Jury President. These protocols may involve adjusting event timelines, rescheduling, or cancelling rounds or stages. If an event is cancelled, no medals, prizes, or ranking points will be awarded.

12. Technical Officials

12.1 B) Removed.



- 12.1 E) one or more CEC Head Judge(s) to act in the capacity of category judge, and to replace the Jury President should he/she be unable to start or continue.
- 12.2 A) a competition First Aid Attendant. The Competition First Aid Attendant will advise the CEC Jury President whether an athlete may continue to safely compete.
- 12.2 D) a team of routesetters to work with the Head Routesetter appointed by the CEC.

Annex A – Lead Events

1. General

1.1 Lead events take place on purpose-designed, artificial climbing walls having a minimum width of 3 meters for each route on the wall. The height of the wall should not be less than 15m.




APPENDIX A: CEC YOUTH C/D SPEED ROUTE (10m)


Reference: <u>World Climbing Competition Regulations Para Climbing Events</u> (Version 1.0 March 2025)

1. General

- 1.1 The CEC may approve the organisation of events:
 - Canadian Speed National Championship
 - Canadian Para-Climbing National Championship
 - Canadian Senior Boulder National Championship
 - Canadian Senior Lead National Championship
 - Canadian Youth Boulder Eastern | Western Regional
 - Canadian Youth Boulder National Championship
 - Canadian Youth Lead National Championship
 - Other sanctioned climbing competition including
 - North American Cup Series (NACS)
- 1.3 The CEC will issue an Event Central Page on its website not less than 60 days in advance of the competition confirming its location, registration deadline and arrangements as described in §6 of the CEC Rules Amendment (Part 3). The registration deadline should not be less than 2 weeks to the first day of the competition.
- 1.4 The CEC sanctioned Para Climbing events are open to all qualified para climbing athletes. All athletes must hold a CEC Licence.
- 1.5 CEC Members are the Provincial and Territorial Sport Organizations (PTSOs). Refer to the CEC website for an up to date list of members.



1.6 If there are less than 3 athletes registered in a single sport class, the following merging pattern will be used:



- AU2 (Upper Limb Amputee *not allowed to use prosthetic)
- AU3 (Hand impairment)
- **AL1** (Bilateral Lower limb impairment)
- **AL2** (Unilateral Lower Limb Amputee *prosthetics allowed)
- **B1** (Visually Impaired: Completely or almost completely blind *must wear blindfold during competition regardless of sight)
- **B2** (Visually Impaired: Moderately blind)
- **B3** (Visually Impaired: Legally blind with corrective measures)
- **RP1** (Range of Power: Severe impact)
- **RP2** (Range of Power: Moderate impact)
- **RP3** (Range of Power: Mild impact)
- 1.7 No changes.
- 1.8 Where a mixed-category event or Combined Class Event is proposed, the competitors registered affected will have 10 days to re-confirm non-participation. If, at the end of this time, the minimum registration requirements are not satisfied for the proposed mixed-category or Combined Class, the category or combined-class will be cancelled from the event.

If the Jury President agrees that a serious safety issue exists, they must address the issue without delay. Any Safety Petition, and its resolution, must be reported to the CEC Executive Director.
